NEIC Sail Training Voyages 2023



SAIL TRAINING IRELAND sail, train, learn, <u>live ...</u> The fourth NEIC Sail Training project took place this Summer. Twenty-six people from the Northeast Inner City of Dublin took part in the two weeklong voyages aboard the tall ship Pelican of London. The participants had the fantastic opportunity to become part of the working crew of a tall ship as trainees. This year's project had two voyages one for 14 – 17-year-olds and one for Over 18s.

The Under 18 voyage started and finished in Dublin with the Over 18's starting in Rosslare and finishing in Dublin. The participants were nominated for places by various youth and community groups from the NEIC.

This opportunity was made possible by funding support from Dublin City Council and the Northeast Inner City (NEIC) Programme Office, with trainee recruitment coordinated by Sail Training Ireland.

THE VOYAGES



Over 18's Voyage

The first group set sail from Rosslare Port on 18th June 2023. The ship sailed around the Irish Sea, including a visit to the UK, taking in Lundy Island, Tenby and Fishguard. They also got to meet and trade stories of their adventures with trainees from Tall Ship Tenacious who was anchored nearby



in Lundy. The voyage concluded with a challenging trip back to anchor overnight in Scotsman's Bay off Dun Laoghaire, before docking back in Dublin on the 24th of June.

Under 18's Voyage

The second group to set sail departed Dublin on 25th June. They sailed North and dropped anchor off Drogheda. The following day they headed for Scotland and to Dundoon on the Cowal Peninsula. The stop in Scotland included an educational trip in to see Glasgow. The ship arrived back into Dublin on the 1st of July where trainees were welcomed home by family and friends.
